


are in addition to our regular feature articles from the Ministry team (Jay, Kelly, and Zak).

# Rev Jay Robinson

As we begin to head into my favourite month of the year and favourite season of the church something else that will be special is happening – we will be returning to worship in person!

Bruce and I attended a funeral just before we headed off for a week of leave the day that all the restrictions were lifted, well most of them. To sit in a service of worship, the thanksgiving for a life well lived, and to sing and hear those around you singing was just sooo nice!

As we begin Advent our focus will be around Speaking Out and the words that we could be using as well as the words that are connected to every Advent – Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. This time of Advent, waiting expectantly for the coming of the Christ, is a time to prepared for the time that love came to earth in form of Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus came to show us the love of God and to reconnect us to our creator, the one who made us in God's image.

As we come into Advent and the celebration of the incarnation of Christ – God with us – let us become part of that incarnation, the people of God in this place and time, Christ like to the community and to each other.

DAILY DEVOTION - SPRINGS IN THE VALLEY

# Lois Bates

This is from my Daily Reading Springs in the Valley  $-13^{th}$  November. Thought of sharing it with the wider church at MUC.

"Now unto Him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy" – Jude 1:24

Take that word keep and hold it close to your heart tonight and tomorrow. It is one of the great and magnificent messages of the Gospel -"He is able to keep you from falling". Put into the word, you, all the weakness, all the unworthiness, all the sinfulness which belongs to man since the Fall; yet, He is able to keep you. He does not underrate the disadvantage of it being you when He bids His messengers say He is "Able to keep you from falling". It would be impossible, utterly impossible, were it not undertaken by Infinite Love. Look out, and up, then. Look up "from the depth" - the vast depth of your weakness, perhaps of your mysteriously inherited weakness. Look out

of your failure under some temptation, inward or outward, inherited so to speak from yourself, from your own unfaithfulness in the past. Look up out of your ruined purposes – unto Himself.

Being what He is, Keeper of Israel, God of the Promise, Lord of the Sacrifice, Prince of Life, Present Saviour Indwelling Power, He is able to keep you, that your feet shall not totter. They shall stand "in a large room, they shall hold on straight, until at last they enter, step by step – for it is one step at a time even then – through the Gates into the City".

For comparison, 2021: Estimated deficit \$3,254 and 2020: Deficit \$13,967

On a Sunday morning at 10am, as I tune in to our church service via Facebook, I have a photo of mum looking down on me.


I just love the introductory old hymns usually played on an organ, which start the service.


